Jacqueline Barnes has taught and conducted research in the USA and the UK. Her current research interests are: evaluation of early intervention programmes related to children's health and development and parenting; community characteristics as they relate to family functioning and children; the use and impact of child care in the early years and the relevance of parental age for child and family outcomes. Professor Barnes was one of the directors of the National Evaluation of Sure Start in the UK, she directed a randomised trial (Right from the Start) to evaluate a volunteer home-visiting programme for mothers and new babies and she directed the formative evaluation of implementing the home-visiting Family Nurse Partnership programme in England and an RCT of a modification of this programme, Group Family Nurse Partnership. She is currently an investigator in the European ISOTIS study, leading the work that examines inter-agency collaboration.
